- District English Learner Advisory Council (DELAC)
- Special Education Parent Advisory Council (SpEdPAC)
- Community Equity Roundtable

De estos grupos, los padres son elegidos para los grupos de trabajo para representar a los miembros de los padres en todo el distrito.

NOT YOUR AVERAGE BAKE SALE!

Many people have the misconception that School Parent Councils are just for bake sales.

Your Parent Council is a place where parents can voice their concerns regarding the conditions of their schools and use collective power to take action and advocate for solutions.



Parents are essential to improving the:

- Quality of Education
- School Environment
- Supports & Resources

School Site Councils

- Parents can take on any role in the School Site Council including Treasurer, Co-chair, etc.
- Parents can also join the Personnel subcommittee, which hires new school staff and more!
- Any parent can attend and comment, but only elected members can vote on decisions.



Parents can also advocate by joining a school based Equity Roundtable!

PARENTS-CREATING CHANGE AT SCHOOL!

The SPC works closely with the School Site Council to review the school's budget, recommend programs, sponsor events, solve problems, and raise funds for special school activities.

SSC Reviews, comments and APPROVES the entire school budget including materials, supplies, textbooks and equipment.

50% of voting members must be parents.

PARENTS-ADVOCATING AT DISTRICT LEVEL

Parents can participate in the planning, development, and evaluation of the school district's general programs (CPC), special education programs (SpEdPAC), and English Language Learner Programs (DELAC).

From these groups, parents are elected to task forces to represent district-wide parent voice.



All Parents can join District level groups to learn and advocate at:

- Citywide Parent Council (CPC)
- District English Learner Advisory Council (DELAC)
- Special Education Parent Advisory Council (SpEdPAC)
- Community Equity Roundtable



WHAT HAPPENS WHEN PARENTS ARE INVOLVED?

When parents are involved at school, the performance of all the children at school, not just their own, tends to improve. The more comprehensive and well planned the partnership between school and home, the higher the student achievement.
